Our Modern Foreign Languages curriculum is taught from Year 3 to Year 6 and the language taught is French. These skills are built upon year after year throughout and until the end of Key Stage 2. Within the languages curriculum, children learn through listening to the language being spoken by a native (through video clips), practicing the language with their peers, writing the vocabulary and re-capping it in the following lesson. Children throughout Key Stage 2, study the same topics but the content is differentiated for the age group and ability. Children are encouraged to speak, write and read in the language they are studying.

This part of the curriculum allows children to build on their cultural awareness and develop communication and understanding skills in a whole new language. This will help the children to foster positive attitudes to other cultures and use their knowledge with growing confidence and competence to understand what they hear and read, and to express themselves in both speech and writing. Our vision for French, at St Oswald's Primary School, is to ensure that pupils have a cultural awareness so that they leave as responsible, happy pupils with some understanding of the French language and its culture.
