The MFL classroom must be a democratic classroom where all pupils have an equal right to be heard and democracy is modelled by the teacher and expected of every pupil. Children will consider what life is like for individuals living in France (and sometimes other French speaking countries).	As part of learning about other cultures, laws of France and French speaking countries will be mentioned, comparing them with British laws.	Children will explore their own individual liberty by considering themselves as global citizens and beginning to explore possibilities for travelling to, or even working in, other parts of the world when they are older.	Mutual respect is taught and given when children are expressing their opinions and beliefs. Children are taught and encouraged to show respect to each other's beliefs, feelings and opinions by giving each child a forum to share these on with the expectation that these must be listened to.	Pupils are taught about historical, cultural and religious differences between the UK and France (with some reference to other French speaking countries as well). Other cultures are always discussed in a respectful manner, emphasising that although things may be different, each culture is equally valuable and to be respected.
